Santa's not the only one making deliveries this year - our very own Noel Burns has been out and about delivering much needed donations to local charities.

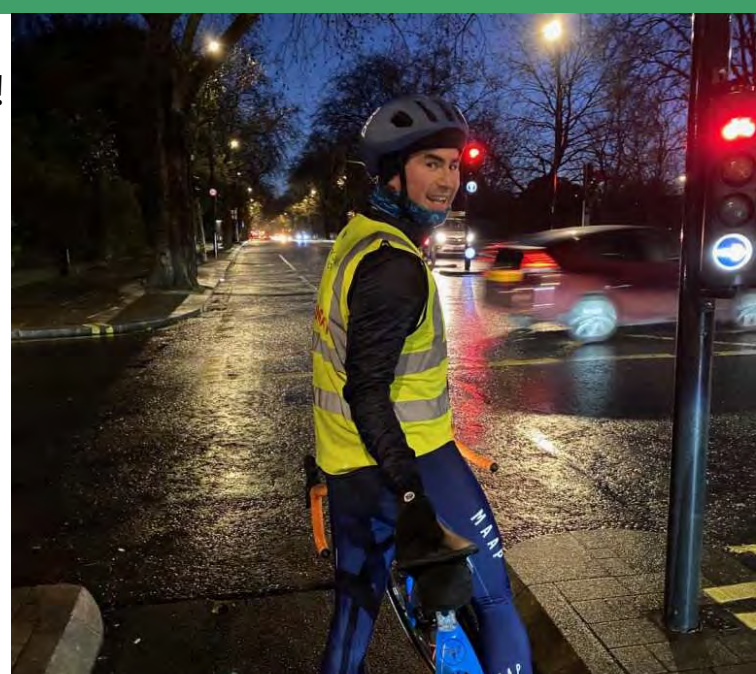
Noel is pictured above with Theresa Dauncey, CEO of The National Brain Appeal, donating a John Lewis Christmas hamper for their annual raffle.
